


Freedom to petition is what allows us to do what we do in our Legislative Program. To petition our elected leaders is to tell them what's on our mind. It was written into the First Amendment for a




As we know, speaking your mind at the ballot box wasn't a reality for everyone. These sheroes suffered mightily so that women could vote and fully participate in democracy.

Several decades later, these brave Americans were attacked and arrested for demanding an equal voice in our democracy.


I tell you this so that we don't take our right to vote and to petition for granted.

They hang out with you. You hang out with them. Everybody has fun.









Senators and congressmen get hundreds and hundreds of communications every day. We want ours' to stand apart from the rest.

Why not come up with a fun limerick?




This next part is very important so memorize it.




The VFW Auxiliary is not, I repeat, NOT a conservative or liberal organization. We have no official opinion about parties or politicians.
