5 Ways to Show Your Patriotism

Beyond the flag-waving many of us want to show our patriotism in more heartfelt ways. Here are some suggestions:

- **1. Vote.** One of the best ways to honor the principles upon which our nation was built is to vote. If you can, volunteer to work at the polls during an election and you can see our system of government in action.
- **2. Support a veteran.** Do more than thank them for their service. If you know a veteran of the Vietnam or Korean wars, or even World War II, take some time to lend them a hand. Mow their lawns, offer to take them to the pharmacy, or send them a gift basket. Most would even appreciate a few minutes of meaningful conversation.
- **3. Fly the Stars and Stripes correctly.** The Federal Flag Code has strict guidelines on how to display and oversee the flag. For example, if the flag is flying at night, it must be illuminated. While you are at it, why not help a veteran show his or her pride in our nation by helping them install a flag display?
- **4. Support our national parks.** The National Park Service has always operated on a small budget, and proposed budget cuts may make the situation worse. Staff, hours, and amenities may all be reduced or eliminated. Make it a point to visit our national parks. Buy a pass for some Veterans and you can also donate to a specific park or a friend of the park organization.
- **5. Serve on a jury.** Jury duty may seem like an inconvenience at times, but it is part of what makes this nation great.



National Symbol- The Purple Heart

In 1932, on what would have been Washington's 200th birthday, the Purple Heart, which recognizes injuries received at war, was brought forth in direct relation to the first military badge of merit created and given to soldiers by Washington.

The Badge of Military Merit (the original Purple Heart) was established by order of George Washington on August 7, 1782, said order including the following statement:

"Let it be known that he who wears the military order of the purple heart has given of his blood in the defense of his homeland and shall forever be revered by his fellow countrymen."

How Can Your Auxiliary Celebrate Purple Heart Day-

- Buy and use Purple Heart printed US Stamps
- Place flowers on gravesites of recipients.
- Send greeting cards to Veterans at your local VA Hospital who earned the Purple Heart Medal
- Educate our Youth by giving coloring pages of the Purple Heart Medal (see attachment)
