

VFW National Home

... Continuing with "Beginnings", Did you know the origins of today's VFW National Home can be traced to a 23-year-old woman named Amy Ross. In 1922, Ross made it her mission to help find jobs for the thousands of unemployed veterans in Detroit.

On Jan. 7, 1925, the VFW National Home was founded, helping to fulfill the VFW pledge to "honor the dead by helping the living." Later that spring, the Home welcomed its first family in an old frame farmhouse, Mrs. Pollett and her six children. Pollett had become suddenly widowed and lost her husband's military pension.

The VFW National Home has transformed from an old frame farmhouse to a sprawling campus with playgrounds; park areas; and multiple buildings, including single-family homes, a community center and gymnasium, childcare facility, guest lodge, chapel, and administrative offices.

Now, nearly one hundred years later, the National Home continues evolve to meet the ever-changing needs of America's military and veterans' families. Through it all, one thing has remained constant: the National Home's commitment to honor our nation's veterans and active-duty military by providing help and hope for their children and families.

Here's a slight glimpse into some of the services the VFW National Home provides: <u>Education</u> – Tutoring, Life Skills, Computer Lab, Library, Summer Enrichment Science Lab, and Community service and Patriotism. <u>Recreation</u>, <u>Case Management</u>, and <u>Day Care</u> (The Early Education Center is home to the National Home's on-site early childhood education program.) Built in 1945, the Child Care and Early Education Center is a full-service, statelicensed childcare facility with classrooms for infants, toddlers and preschool/school-age children. Teachers work closely with parents and one another to help each individual child reach his or her full potential, and parents are encouraged to take an active role in their child's development. Here, children up to 6 years of age receive high-quality care in a safe and nurturing environment designed with them in mind. National Home residents can utilize the facility at no cost while working or attending school. This is another great part of the VFW National Home that you can choose to Donate to, the Nursery.






CALIFORNIA 2 HOUSE

- 2) Bring your decorated house with you to our COA in October in Bakersfield (Sharonda & Deb's Homecoming)
- 3) All our 17 homes will be displayed, and members will vote on their favorite(s) by donating in your home.
- 4) The donations will be counted and the District with the most donations will win a prize, and your "Home/Bank" will be taken to the Western Conference (Hawaii in November) to represent the Department of California.
- 5) You can use your decorated home to collect donations prior to our COA in October in Bakersfield and those donations will be counted for your home. IDEALLY, CHECK IS PREFERRED TO CASH...Bring a check payable to Department of California and Julie will combine all and write a check to VFW National Home.

SHOULD YOUR BANK BE CHOSEN TO REPRESENT DEPT OF CA, YOU WILL BE GIVEN A "LENDER BANK TO CARRY YOU THROUGH UNTIL YOURS IS RETURNED.

DISTRICT "HOME/BANK" CONTEST

- 1) Our FINAL judgement will take place at Department President Sharonda's Convention in June 2025.
- 2) At least one Buddy Poppy must be used in its entirety. Tin or the original one.
- 3) House size no larger than 18 inches wide, and 18 inches long, height is the actual height of the "Home/Bank". You may have a Flagpole up to 12 inches high.
- 4) Decorate: 3Dementional, painted, just be creative.
- 5) PRIZES: Third Place is a VFW National Home Poker Chip, Second Place will be a VFW National Homa Ball Cap, and First place will be a VFW National Home Polo Shirt.
