#### **Navy Day**

In 1922, the Navy League of the United Stated selected October 27th as 'Navy Day', a day in which to recognize and celebrate our Naval Forces.



### Statue of Liberty Birthday October 28

- Off with her HEAD!- In 1982, people discovered that the head had actually been installed 2 feet off center. Whoopsie!
- No **visitors** in the Torch- In 1916 the statue suffered minor damages from the Germans and nobody has been allowed to go into the torch since. Well, surely they could have had it all sorted by now?
- **Lightning Strikes**! It is thought that the Statue has actually been struck 600 times by lightning... what would you expect from a huge monument made of metal?
- **Chains** Though you cannot see at the statue's feet there are broken shackles symbolizing the country moving forward from oppression and slavery. She is also moving her right foot towards a new, free era.
- **Green Color?** The statue is green because of the oxidation of copper. It's not paint! The metal is slightly damaged and corroded.
- **Pin up Gal** The girl isn't that skinny. Being 35 feet across the waist and with a size 879 shoe, she really is on the larger side. Big is beautiful!
- What a disaster! 'Disaster movie star, rather. The statue destroyed in the movie *Independence Day* (1996) has been a feature in many other films.
