This year we are being asked to focus on the three areas above. In addition to all the things we normally do, we are challenged to be creative and innovative to find new ways to provide support to our veterans, active military and their families. But first we have to educate ourselves on all these programs so that we, in turn, can pass on information to others.

Veterans and Military Support Programs & National Veterans Service

The **VFW National Veterans Service (NVS)** provides a network of service officers who help Veterans obtain the benefits they have earned in including compensation, access to health care, education and pension benefits.

The **VFW Veterans & Military Support Programs** include the Military Assistance Program, Unmet Needs and the "Sport Clips Help a Hero Scholarship."

What can we do to support these programs?

- **We can** send monetary donations. The mailing information for NVS and Veterans and Military Support can be found in the Quick Reference Guide for Donations towards the beginning of this Program Book
- **We can** become familiar with the work the NVS does and what type of benefits Veterans may be eligible for and help to spread awareness
- We can send care packages to deployed troops
- We can apply for financial grants from the VFW to host events to support and recognize our troops
- We can run programs to help reduce food insecurity for the families of active military
- What other ideas do you have?

Suicide Prevention and Mental Health Awareness

While the number of veterans committing suicide each day has reduced in recent years, even one death is too many. In addition, many veterans and active military suffer from invisible injuries and emotional stress and they may not recognize the signs or know how to get help.

What can we do to help?

- We can familiarize ourselves with the signs of emotional suffering so that we can help others
- We can be willing to have conversations about mental health and emotional wellbeing
- We can host events to raise awareness of Suicide Prevention and Mental Health Awareness
- We can become familiar with resources such as the Veterans Crisis Line and other available service providers
- We can host therapeutic activities such as painting, crafts, yoga or music
- **We can** support our local Vet Centers which provide readjustment counselling for combat veterans and military sexual trauma
- What other ideas do you have?

National Citations and/or awards may be available for the Auxiliary that hosts the most outstanding activity and/or event to increase awareness of suicide and mental health for veterans, military and their families. An entry form is required and is available in MALTA Member Resources. Entries are due to me by March 31, 2025 for judging.

Child Care for Active-Duty Service Members

By providing support for the children of active-duty military, we also provide support for their parents. Just little things can make a big difference in reducing stress or improving their quality of life.

What can we do?

- We can offer to baby sit or child mind for a few hours
- We can provide gift baskets for new mothers with things like diapers and other newborn necessities
- We can sew or purchase clothing for children
- We can lend a caring ear to a stressed first-time mother or father whose spouse may be deployed
- We can host activities for the children of our Adopt-a-Troop
- What other ideas do you have?
