Suicide Prevention and Mental Health Awareness

Many combat veterans experience ongoing challenges as they adjust to post-service life, including mental and emotional difficulties related to their experiences. The transition from military service can mark the beginning of new struggles for many veterans. It is important to maintain awareness of potential warning signs in anyone who may be experiencing suicidal thoughts. Support resources are available, including the 988 lifeline (Press 1).

The VFW's National Veterans Service (NVS) offers free assistance to veterans, service members, and their families through a network of Accredited Service Officers with experience in VA claims. The Pre-Discharge program, established in 2001 in collaboration with the Pentagon and VA, assists active-duty personnel in obtaining entitlements and benefits during their transition out of service, with offices located near major military bases. Military Appreciation Program (MAP)

The VFW Military Appreciation Program (MAP) connects local VFW Posts with military communities worldwide, supporting service members and families since 2005. Citations will be mailed directly to winning VFW Auxiliaries from National Headquarters and money will be deposited into the VFW Auxiliary account after the 2026 VFW Auxiliary National Convention.
