Sponsoring and Working with Youth Groups Youth Groups Supporting Our Veterans Citations – Patriotic Youth Award Patriotism through Literacy – Illustrating America

The youth of today are America's future leaders. And possibly our future Auxiliary or Post members. We, as an organization, need to teach them what it means to be involved, patriotic and an American. They need to learn about service, dedication, traditions, and sacrifices that are made everyday by those who have served and are serving now. When working with the youth, it is important to consider their safety and their needs. You can do this by looking at the "10 Tips for Working with Youth", which can be found in Malta under Resources – Youth Activities.

Sponsoring and Working with Youth Groups

- Auxiliaries can sponsor any youth groups, engaging them in any one of our programs, including activities to
 honor our veterans or assist our service members and their families. Many youth focused organizations
 and college bound seniors require various types of community service or activities to earn merits or units
 for credit. In our Youth Activities Program, we have something for every age group. Within our schools and
 the community, we can support, sponsor and work with the following:
- The Scouts
- Church Youth Groups
- Boy & Girls Club
- School Sponsored Groups i.e. Future Farmers, ROTC.

High school students can use volunteer hours for college applications: some require letters of recommendation. Scouts can earn points toward merit badges.

How do we get the youth involved?

- Placing flags on graves Memorial Day (This can also be reported under Americanism.)
- Helping serve meals and clean up at Veterans Dinners.
- Feeding the homeless, helping with clothing and toiletries distribution.
- Helping box up and hand out food at distribution locations for those in need.
- Organizing assembly, collection and delivery of care packages for the Troops by assisting your local Blue Star Mothers.
- Starting a Community Garden to help Seniors and families in need grow fresh vegetables and fruits.

Youth Groups Supporting Our Veterans - Patriotic Youth Award

Always remember to act responsibly and respectfully around the youth. After they have helped, recognize them for a job well done by presenting them with one of our Patriotic Youth Awards. The **Youth Groups Supporting Our Veterans Citation** can also be found in MALTA Member Resources under Youth Activities. It is important that we recognize and tell the students how much we appreciate them for all their hard work and dedication.

Patriotism through Literacy

Our children learn to read at an early age, and many students have nightly reading assignments daily. Reading has many benefits such as improved grammar, writing skills, improved focus, concentration, helps children to understand as well as share the feelings of others while stretching the child's imagination.

This is our opportunity to help teach and educate students about patriotism, the flag, and our country. We can teach them by going online and logging in to MALTA members resources, under Youth Activities we have the Patriotism through Literacy list of books. It was updated 2024 – 2025. It is a six-page list divided by grade levels. The list includes Creative Non – Fiction, Educational / Americana & Historical Fiction, Historical Fiction, and Non-Fiction / Memoir.

Check with your local library to see if they have the books in stock. If not, maybe your Auxiliary can do a book drive asking for books from the list. Or vote to approve on your auxiliary floor to purchase and donate books on the list to the schools or the libraries, and even the local shelters.

Reading Buddies

Many children in school suffer from issues concerning reading and comprehension. Imagine what an impact we could have on their daily lives and self-confidence. If one person from each Auxiliary would reach out to help a child become a better reader through reading one on one or electronically, we could make a big impact on their lives. Many adults still struggle with reading due to issues growing up but continue to work to overcome them. Benefits of Patriotism through Literacy

- By teaching student's various times in American history, it helps to expose students to different experiences that promote empathy, reflect on hardships, struggles, and overcoming obstacles.
- Spending time in the community with the students by hosting a day of reading where veterans read to the students, or the students can read to the veterans. The veterans can reflect and share the stories that may be like what they are reading about. The month of November would be a good time to help promote the reading program. Check with your local schools about setting up reading days.
- Volunteer to read at your local library. Read a historical or creative non-fiction book to the students. Set up a day and time in the month of February around Presidents Day. Set up a day to read every month.
- Before visiting a VA or nursing home, see if the staff would set up an area for the children to read to the
 veterans or the veterans read to the children.
- Volunteer to help tutor students with their reading skills by reading stories that teach patriotism, the flag, and about our country.
- Your auxiliary can create and host a read a thon using R.A.P. Cards as the point system for earning small award prizes. (stickers, pins, books, etc.)
- Run a writer's workshop for aspiring teen and tween authors at your home Post.
 Invite an author of historical fiction or creative nonfiction to do a book talk/signing in your area.
- **September 6, 2025**, is National Read a Book Day. Celebrate that day by hosting veterans and children to your Post. Maybe have members dress up in historical costumes, such as Uncle Sam, Betsy Ross, or President Lincoln. Maybe have some books on hand to give out to the children.

March 2, 2026, is Dr. Seuss Day. You can volunteer to read a book at your local elementary school to the students. You could also dress in character if you are reading a book about someone special.

Illustrating America

We all love it when our children or grandchildren bring home that fridge- worthy "masterpiece" that immediately goes up on the fridge. We can help to promote and flourish their artistic talent even more by promoting the Illustrating America program which is open to any student in grades K – 8 by the March 31, 2026, deadline who is enrolled in a public, private or parochial school or home study program in the United States, its territories and possessions; or dependents of U.S military or civilian personnel in overseas schools. Although U.S. citizenship is not required, students must be lawful U.S. permanent residents or have applied for permanent residence (the application for which has not been denied) and intend to become a U.S. citizen. Foreign exchange students and students aged 15 or older are ineligible. National grade division winners of previous Illustrating America contests may enter the subsequent grade division but are ineligible for the same grade division of which they are a previous National winner.

Entries will be judged on patriotic themes and technique. The contest consists of three grade divisions: K- 2. 3 – 5, and 6 – 8. The **Department** first place winner in each grade division will be forwarded to Auxiliary National Headquarters.

There are National awards for first, second and third place in each grade division. The first, second, and third place entry in each grade division will be displayed at the National Convention. Please see the student brochure and entry form in the MALTA member resources or on the VFW Auxiliary website for more details on requirements and contest rules.

Deadlines:

Entries received by Local Auxiliary – March 31, 2026

Department Headquarters – April 15, 2026

National Headquarters - May 5, 2026

Contest Rules:

- Entry must be completed during the current school year
- Art must be two dimensional.
- Art must be on canvas or paper.
- Paper entries must be reinforced with heavy paper.
- Watercolor, pencil, pastel, charcoal, tempera, crayon, acrylic, pen, ink, oil, marker, acrylic, chalk, glitter or other media may be used.
- Submit canvas entries on a stretcher frame or canvas board. Other entries, if matted, must be matted in white or reinforced with heavy paper.
- Do **not** frame art with wood, metal, plastic, or glass.
- Mats may be used, including mounted and floating mats.
- The art should be no smaller than 8"X10" but no larger than 18" x 24", not including the mat.
- If the American flag is used, it does not need to conform to the Federal Flag Code in relation to colors, number of starts and stripes and other pertinent rules of the code.
- Coloring sheets, digital art and photography are not accepted.
- Completed typed or printed legible entry form including parent and/or guardian signatures Students' name, age, and grade level <u>MUST</u> be printed on back of the entry.
- Mailing entries Please do not mail or ship in tubes, with the entry rolled up. It severely affects the
 entry.

To avoid entrant disqualification

- Make sure your Auxiliary Name Number District- State are on the bottom section
- March 31: Auxiliary Youth Chairman verification signature
- April: Optional VFW Auxiliary District Judging

April 15,2026 - must be to Department Youth Activities Chairman by April 15,2026.

R.A.P. Cards

"Random Acts of Patriotism" (R.A.P.) Cards can be given out to any youth who are showing:

- Patriotism
- Thanking a Veteran
- Placing American flags on veteran graves
- Raising funds for a veteran's memorial and marching in patriotic holiday parades.

These are just a few but there are many more examples that can be recognized. When the child shows Random Acts of Patriotism, recognize them with the R.A.P. card and explain to them why they are receiving. Show and tell them how proud you are of them.

Entry form required and available in MALTA Member Resources – Youth Activities. VFW Auxiliaries must send the required entry form to their Department Youth Activities Chairman by **March 31, 2026,** for judging. The Department Youth Activities Chairman must sign and send a copy of the completed Department- winning entry form to the National Youth Activities Chairman by **April 30, 2026,** for judging.

Citations will be mailed directly to the winning VFW Auxiliaries from National headquarters and money will be deposited into the winning VFW Auxiliary account after the 2026 VFW Auxiliary National Convention in Reno, Nevada.

Awards for Department and Department Chairman

- 1. \$25 VFW Store gift certificate to one Department Youth Activities Chairman in each of the 10 Program Divisions for the best promotion of implementing youth reading to the veterans and/or veterans reading to youth.
- 2. The Outstanding Performance Award and Second Place Outstanding Performance Award will be awarded in each of the 10 Program Divisions based on the criteria listed on Page 5 and for the promotion of the program goals listed at the top of Page 56.

Winners will be announced and awards presented at the 2026 VFW Auxiliary National Convention in Reno, Nevada.
